

Women's position in society has grown extraordinarily in the last century. There has been an increase in the number of women steadily moving up the ladder in both public and private sectors. The voice of prominent women leaders has become louder and stronger. Their actions have become more decisive and influential. However, this is a small minority of women who have advanced to senior and powerful positions whilst many millions still play the traditional role of mother and caregiver in the family setting and are exposed to a plethora of social, cultural, legal, technological and institutional barriers.

The presence of few women in powerful positions ("glass ceiling") raises the question of why, given the changing role of women in the past decade. In celebration of Women's Month, this event resonates with Goal 5 of United Nations Sustainable Development Goals to achieve gender equality and empower all women and girls across the globe in a wide variety of settings and contexts. Furthermore, we look at how leadership, legal frameworks and technological considerations impact on their potential for leadership positions and the hampering and enabling factors that impact on their quest to succeed.



Many governments have signed and ratified international, regional and sub-regional agreements and instruments aiming to promote women's empowerment and gender equality, however legal barriers continue to prevent women from being fully empowered. According to OECD Gender Equality Report (2022) women shy away from entering certain professions deemed as hazardous, which restricts their access to labour markets and are often rooted in stereotypes regarding men's and abilities, specifically physical abilities and traditional gender roles. Sima Bahou, the United Nations Under-Secretary-General and Executive Director of UN-Women (2023) asserts that innovation and technological change are deep shifts reshaping life in the twenty- first century. Technological progress allows for unprecedented advances with the potential to improve social, economic and political outcomes for all. Yet these advances and outcomes are not equally shared. As the online world becomes more important in people's lives, the acceleration of technological change heightens the risk of further entrenching these inequalities. Women and girls have made significant contributions to human innovation, yet remain underrepresented in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). Each time a woman stands up for herself, she represents all women with her inimitable voice, unique style and inspirational vision. This online event showcases how she has flourished above setbacks, barriers and gender bias to become leaders in their fields.

Prof. Keolebogile Motaung, a distinguished Biomedical Scientist and Full Professor at Durban University of Technology, boasts over 24 years of experience in Higher Education. Her expertise lies in stem cells, tissue engineering, and regenerative medicine, earning her international recognition. She serves as the president of the African Tissue Engineering and Regenerative Medicine International Society (ATERMIS) and has an extensive publication record in her field. Prof. Motaung is devoted to capacity building, guiding postgraduates and nurturing emerging researchers. She is an advocate for science, innovation, and technology, promoting entrepreneurship and research commercialization, especially for women in STEM. She founded Global Health Biotech, creating La-Africa Soother, a natural anti-inflammatory ointment for athletes, and licensed technology for a plant-based pump protein shake. She has garnered numerous awards for her pioneering work, bridging the gap between science, business, and entrepreneurship, including recognition for her leadership, innovation, and impact in various institutions.



Fitore Pacolli Dalipi is a Kosovo Assembly Member, Chair of the Parliamentary Committee on Environment, Food, Agriculture, Forestry, Member of the Parliamentary Committee on Foreign Affairs. She is pursuing a PhD at the University of Graz and holds an MSc in Politics and Government of the European Union from the London School of Economics and Political Sciences (LSE). Fitore possesses two bachelor degrees, a BA (Hons) in Politics and International Relations from London Metropolitan University, and a BA in English Language and Literature professional history includes being the Chief of Cabinet at the Municipality of Prishtina and an active role in the Movement for Self-Determination, where she leads the Committee on Foreign Affairs since 2012.



Dr. Sherifa Fouad is the Executive Director of the National Institute for Governance and Sustainable Development (NIGSD). Sherif is a tenured Professor of Public Administration at the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo University. She headed The Public Administration Research and Consultation Center (PARC) at the Faculty of Economics and Political Science, Cairo Universityfor three consecutive years. She has been teaching for almost twenty years in theareas Public Administration, Management, Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), Sustainable Development, Social Entrepreneurship, Environmental Management, Governance and Gender and Development.
